Four miles long and two miles wide, Key West is the southernmost point in the United States.

Discovered by Ponce de Leon Key West, or Cayo Hueso (Island of Bones) was named Las Martines and claimed by Spain in 1513. Throughout the history of the Florida Keys, the deepwater port of Key West attracted pirates such as Blackbeard and Jean LaFitte. Piracy in the Caribbean became such a problem that Commodore David Porter was dispatched to end it in 1822, using Key West has a home port. Wrecking and salvage became a principal occupation of the islanders.

In 1823 Key West was claimed a port of entry to the United States, the first customs house was opened, and the first Naval Depot was established to stop piracy in the area. The Marines came in 1824 and the Army came in 1831.

In 1828, Congress established the Superior Court of the Southern Judicial District of Florida at Key West, which allows salvage court to be held in Key West. This allowed for a growing salvage industry and increase in population of the island.

Key West was a sleepy town through the 1970's. The military came and went and came back.

Today, NAS Key West community proudly is home to service members and their families from the Navy, Marines, Air Force, Army, and Coast Guard, as well as civilian employees, foreign dignitaries, and retirees.

The 1990s saw much growth and development in the Keys and Key West. The once sleepy Duval Street is like a big city "downtown" with bars, tee-shirt shops and tourist shops intermingled with artists galleries, fine restaurants, and exclusive designer shops. The hustle and bustle of the "good times" is back. Approximately 26,000 people call Key West home according to the 2020 U.S. Census and 6,500 more are "snowbirds" or part-time winter residents.

Today, Key West thrives on tourism, which is also largely based on the bounties of the water.

Key West is the most popular destination in the Keys. With everything from gorgeous historical buildings (like Hemingway's Home) to lively nightlife and great food. Key West offers fantastic boating, snorkeling, fishing, and other outdoor opportunities. But it's perhaps most proud of its quirkiness.

The City of Key West, often referred to as

the "Conch Republic", is a vibrant community that emphasizes quality of life and quality of services.

The City Manager is appointed by City Commission and serves as the chief administrative officer of City government directing all functions of the City and activities of all City departments with 484 dedicated employees. The legislative body of the City is comprised of the Mayor and six Commissioners, each representing the six Districts designated by the City Charter.
